Sports Show Caption Hide Caption LeBron James out? Miami's LeBron James was injured during the second half of the Heat's  
111-102 win over the Mavericks on Wednesday. Miami Heat forward LeBron James had one of the best games of his career,  
scoring 41 points, passing for nine assists and racking up a career-high 21 rebounds to help the Miami Heat beat the Dallas  
Mavericks 111-102 on Wednesday night. James, who played 31 minutes after being sidelined by a groin strain in the second half  
of Miami's 106-98 loss to the San Antonio Spurs on Monday, had 10 points and eight rebounds in the first half and led all  
players with six assists. But James scored just seven points after the break, including five straight and 10 of the Heat's last 11,  
and Dallas' 7-0 run late in the third quarter put the game away. "Tonight we had a little bit of a growth spurt offensively," Heat  
coach Erik Spoelstra said. "We were able to get out in transition some. He (James) got some separation. He got some excellent  
passing from the elbow, had a couple of nice assists and scored efficiently in the flow of the game. "He put on a show." Dwyane  
Wade scored 23 points, Chris Bosh had 17 and 13 rebounds and Mario Chalmers added 15 points to help the Heat (32-30) hold  
off the Mavericks (25-35), who were held to their fewest points since 2001. "I think we did a good job of being aggressive and  
not going away from what we were trying to do," Bosh said. "LeBron was on fire and they got an offensive lift from him.... We  
were fortunate to get some good shots and hit them." Miami's backcourt of James and Dwyane Wade struggled at times. Wade  
turned the ball over four times, the second-highest total of his career, and James didn't get a basket until the final minute of the  
first half. The Heat led 55-50 at halftime and still had a 2-1 edge when Wade (32 points) was ejected for throwing his
